Chemonics has hired Agnes Wamuyu as a project management officer after she graduated with a bachelor degree in community development and social from KWUST. Agnes's key tasks include, but are not limited to, working with the ministry of health, development partners, and other relevant stakeholders in Murang'a County to ensure effective realization of the project's goal, as well as contributing to the greater goal of the HIV/AIDS management program in the county. To successfully deliver her responsibility, Agnes must make sure she implements this project within the constraints of the "project scope" and avoids the "scope creed".
