- a) "The generations of women in Dahlma Llanos-Figueroa's *Daughters of the Stone* reflect the struggles and triumphs of African and Caribbean women." Discuss. [10 marks]
- b) Which key arguments emerge in Frantz Fanon's *Black Skin*, *White Masks* with regard to identity? [10 marks]

QUESTION THREE (20 MARKS)

- a) "In *Miguel Street*, V.S Naipaul uses characters and their experiences to reflect the complexities of Caribbean society and culture." Critically assess this statement. [10 marks]
- b) How does Jamaica Kincaid's *A Small Place* speak to key voices against colonialism studied in this course? [10 marks]

QUESTION FOUR (20 MARKS)

- a) With reference to Junot Diaz and Edwidge Danticat's writings studied in this course, critically assess of the major concerns of the contemporary Caribbean writer. [10 marks]
- b) How successful is Aimé Césaire's "Discourse on Colonialism" in highlighting the legacies of colonialism in the Caribbean region? [10 marks]
